Be Sure to Keep Your Dogs Warm Too!

Just because dogs have a natural furry coat, doesn't mean they are immune to the cold. Follow some of these do and don'ts in order to keep your family member from becoming a dogsicle!

DO:

- provide proper shelter
- provide a warm sleeping area without drafts
- use caution around bodies of water (lakes, rivers, ponds)
- trim the hair around their paw pads. Less hair will keep their paws free from the build-up of snow and ice
- check your dog's ears, feet, and tail for signs of frostbite

DON'T:

- suddenly house an indoor dog outdoors, dogs require time to adjust to being outside
- keep your dog outside in all conditions, extreme cold can harm any dog even if they are used to being outside all the time
- leave your pets alone in the car during the cold weather months. It's just as harmful as leaving them in the car in the heat of summer
